#### **Definition:**

**Personal Protective Equipment** (PPE) is all equipment including clothing affording protection which is intended to be worn or be held by a person at work and which protects them against one or more risks to their health and safety e.g. face masks, hand sanitizer, gloves

#### **Legal Duties:**

PPE at Work Regulations state that personal protective equipment is to be supplied and used at work wherever there are risks to health and safety that cannot be adequately controlled in other ways. Any PPE is to be provided free of charge and when issued employees/coaches/volunteers are legally obliged to wear it as identified by the relevant risk assessment.



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#### **Arrival**

- Communication with Away team and Match officials to advise them of the access ground layout and ground control measures.
- Before travelling ensure you have self-assessed and do not attend the ground if you have any COVID-19 symptoms which are detailed on the COVID-19 questionnaire.
- On arrival at the car park ensure you follow government guidelines on maintaining a safe distance from others.
- Only make your way to the 3G pitch if it is possible to maintain social distancing from others.
- Wait outside the 3G pitch entrance before entering the ground to allow others in front to leave the entrance area maintaining the appropriate social distance.
- The turn style entrance will be manned and you will be required to confirm that you are not suffering from any COVID-19 symptoms after which you and all entrants will undertake a temperature check before being allowed to enter the stadium. If you are refused entry please return home and seek medical advice.
- Hand sanitiser is available for use at the point of entry and you may proceed around the one-way system when it is free and clear to do so.
- Follow the one-way system and maintain social distancing. Go directly to the allocated training area/ warm up area on the pitch in the red zone if it is free, maintaining social distancing. If your area on the pitch is occupied then remain in the orange zone with players maintaining a social distancing and only allow entry to the pitch when it is been vacated.
- Maximum of number of people as specified by the FA guidance are only permitted in the allocated training area (including coaches) at any one time.
- All match team players may access the red zone maintaining social distancing
- There is a position just passed the pitch entry point for sanitising football training equipment if not already done so.

### **During Training and Warm Ups/Cool Downs**

- Only coaches to touch the training equipment do not ask players to move or collect or set down.
- Players should not handle the balls where possible or unless you are a goalkeeper wearing gloves which should be sanitised regularly. Santitisng solution will be available by each goal for use.
- Players should not spit or chew gum.
- Players should be encouraged to cough and sneeze into their elbow should they need to while in the stadium.
- Players, coaches and officials must follow The FA 'Code of Behaviour'
- Warm-ups/cool-downs should always observe social distancing;

## During Matches – Must be affiliated with local county FA for the 20/21 season before any match play takes place.

- Safety Briefings prior to competitive activities should be provided reminding participants of The FA 'Code of Behaviour' and the requirement to social distance during breaks in play.
- Pre-match handshake should not happen. Instead players will be asked to hand-sanitise before kick-off;



- Team talk huddles should not take place. Team talks can take place, as long as social distancing is observed and held outdoors where possible;
- Coaches, other team staff and substitutes are allowed, but must also always observe social distancing on touchlines/dug-outs. Social-distancing must also be observed during interactions when a substitution is being made;
- Match preparation meetings by officials should be held by video call;
- Set plays free kicks: referees and coaches should encourage players to get on with the game and not unnecessarily prolong set play set-up, such as defensive walls;
- Set plays corners should also be taken promptly to limit prolonged close marking and goal posts should be wiped down before matches, after matches and at half time.
- Goal celebrations should be avoided;
- Interactions with referees and match assistants should only happen with players observing social distancing;
- Small-sided football should be modified to provide more regular hygiene breaks in activity. Players should be discouraged from touching boards at any time, with tackling against boards discouraged. Referees should consider stopping play when this happens.
- Youth football coaches are encouraged to limit persistent close proximity of participants during match play (where young participants may be more likely to cluster around the ball) and provide regular hygiene breaks in activity.
- Kit should be taken home and washed after play.
- Footballs should not be handled unless for throw-ins and if the ball goes outside of the pitch confines then it should be sanitised before re-entering play and an alternative sanitised ball used to help the game flow.
- Goal Posts, sub benches and Flag Posts will be treated with sanitising solution which can last up to 30 days.
- Half Time break goal post and corner flags will be sanitised even though they will be treated with a solution which can continue to work up to 30 days in order to comply with league requirements.

## **Toilets/Changing Rooms**

- Anyone attending training or matches should try and use the toilet before leaving home.
- Toilet facilities will be available at the ground using the one way system as detailed on eh map. Green line and arrow showing entry and blue line and arrow showing exit. Please follow the one-way system around the pitch.
- Toilets will be treated with santising solution which can last up to 30 days.
- On training and match days the toilets will be checked periodically to ensure consumables are present and to sanitise any obvious soiling and door handles.
- Signage will be provided for one-way system and washing of hands.
- Changing Rooms will only be used for changing and showering and no other reason in order to comply with league regulations.
- When changing rooms are open they will be treated with a sanitising solution that can last up to 30 days and notices will be placed inside detailing the maximum number of permitted individuals that are able to maintain social distancing once inside.

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- All Changing room windows and doors where possible should be left open to allow for ventilation.
- Additional changing faculties are available to be used in the Clubhouse in order to aid social distancing and they will be used should more individuals then
  permitted number of individuals requiring access to changing facilities exceed the permitted number for the ground changing rooms. In order to
  facilitate this, away teams will be asked whether they will need the facility and if so for how many individuals.

#### Player Injury at Training or During Match play

If STFC provide a HCPs the HCP will abide by the guidance as depicted by the League, as advised by the Government and the elite sport framework.

STFC first aiders will follow the guidance set out in The FA 'Return to Grassroots Football' as a minimum. The FA guidelines as detailed in the table below wearing the appropriate PPE based on the injury being treated if they need to compromise social-distancing guidelines to provide medical assistance. All PPE will be kept at the ground for use by first aiders and HCPs. A copy of The FA's 'Clubs and Coaches Covid-19 first aid guidance' will be distributed to HCPs and first aiders.

#### Departure

- Players and coaches to leave the pitch by the exit gate marked on the map and follow the one way system around the pitch.
- There is a position at the pitch exit point for santising football training, warm up, match equipment immediately after the session which must be done.
- Hand sanitizer is available at the exit to be used.
- Exit through the perimeter fence gate and wait at a safe distance on the other side for players to be collected by a family member or guardian.
- Maintain social distancing from others at all time.

If the event of an emergency e.g. fire, then please use all available emergency exit points.

#### Showing Symptoms of COVID-19 while at the Stadium

Symptoms are:-

- Has a high temperature (above 37.8oC);
- · Has developed a new continuous cough;
- · Has shortness of breath or a sore throat;
- Loss of or change in normal sense of taste or smell;
- Or generally feels unwell

Should a person show any one of these symptoms then do not travel to the stadium, self-isolate and seek medical advice. If a person has entered the stadium and then shows signs of COVID-19 then they should leave the stadium with an accompanying family member of guardian. If this is not possible then the use of the quarantine room must be used. Quarantine Room RAMS must be followed and are labelled as Stage 2&3 v1.2. Use of professional Cleaning company to decontaminate areas are available upon request. Contact details Wetton Cleaning Services Limited, Contact Tel 0207 237 2007 www.wettons.co.uk.

### **Manned Entry for Access**

- Manned gate area will be sanitised with solution that can last up to 30 days and periodically checked.
- Person manning must not be shielding and must wear gloves and a face mask as a minimum and used hand sanitizer or wash hands prior to commencement of shift.
- Clear divider between turnstyle entrance and manning point.
- Manned gate person to check entrants that they have self checked for COVID-19 symptoms.
- Undertake the Temperature check and refusing entry to anyone failing.
- Once all entrants arrived then will undertake a check of the washrooms and carry out sanitising clean to handle touchpoints an any obvious soiling plus replenish any consumables as required.
- At end of shift dispose of gloves and sanitising hands before departure.
