History of CB Hounslow United



CB Hounslow United F.C is a Football club based in the London Borough of Hounslow. The team was originally named Richmond Rangers, and was a collection of friends and local troubled youth that where losing their path in life.

In season 1987/88 Richmond Rangers where disbanded and reformed in 1988/89 under the name of CB united.

CB Hounslow United FC carry the community flag for football and support in Hounslow, since the demise of the historic Hounslow FC which was formed in 1884. Community support is the essence of what they do as a club.

Currently the club supports Promise Academy for 16 to 18 year olds, with a sports and educational programme, the Promise Academy Mini Kickers and OHM Sports Mini Kickers.

CB stands for 'Cater Bank' which was the company co-owned by the late father of chairman Frank James. CB Hounslow played in the Hounslow & District Football League with some distinction, and after 5 successful years they were promoted to the Middlesex county Football League (MCFL) in 1994/95, changing to their present name CB Hounslow United.

CB Hounslow United 1st team played for 11 years in the MCFL before being promoted to the Combined Counties in 2005/6 season. The club is now affiliated to the Combined Counties League, Middlesex County FL, West Middlesex Sunday League, Allied Counties Youth League, Surrey Youth League, West Middlesex Youth League and

Harrow Youth League and CGL.

This season and going forward the club now has a Patron: Mr Max Lea MBE a stalwart in football, who come up thr,ough the referee ranks and played football for Old Parmiterians Football Club. His support to Club is hugely appreciated and can only benefit the club going forward.

Also Frank, the owner of CB, has handed the reigns over to Mr Dave Fuller who will become the Chairman of the board, allowing Frank to concentrate on just football matters as he enjoys running a team. Dave comes with a huge amount of experience. He is a MCFA Councillor and has officiated in Middlesex for over 50 years and CB itself for 20 years.

The club this season will be competing in The FA Cup, The FA Vase, The FA Youth Cup and MCFA Senior Charity Cup amongst many other Cups.

They would like to thank their numerous sponsors, who donate to the youth teams and the main body of the club and also help greatly with the fundraising. The club continues to grow its partnership with DNATA, United Airlines, Buffa, Tarmac. Mohan's Caterers, AIR Consultants

STFC's plans for Greatness Park

The following is a letter sent to all residents in the area around Greatness Park, outlining our plans for the future of Sevenoaks Town





Dear Neighbour,

Due to the incredible hard work and dedication of everyone involved in the Sevenoaks
Town Football Club, we are now looking to improve the current facilities for the club and local community by providing a development that meets the needs of all who benefit.

This leaflet explains the proposals and the next steps as to how you can hear more about these plans and help with the funding scheme for this important community facility.

Award winning architects, Offset Architects,



have previously assisted the club with their 3G pitch and lighting application, which has been a fantastic success. They have been appointed once again to assist with the new upgrading of the community changing rooms, covered stands and club house facilities.

The proposals will provide six changing rooms with shower, toilet and storage facilities, along with referee and first aid rooms, all to football foundation and football association requirements

In addition to this, the scheme will also provide for a gym, meeting room and flexible function room that can be used by the club and community groups. This building will also function as additional covered standing and seating areas, again to bring the club in line with current regulations.

Design & Massing

In collaboration with the various stake-holders of the site, Offset Architects have been working on a suitable design that would meet the necessary regulations and requirements, whilst also making sure the design and massing are in keeping with its unique open landscape setting.

The initial designs have been reduced in scale to provide the minimum necessary to meet the required size and allow for the town council to retain the existing pavilion for ongoing community use. Creating a part 1 storey and part 2 storey form mimics the sculptural contours of the site, and by creating flat grass roofs, it enables the building to merge into the surrounding green context.

Highways, Access & Parking

The site is well connected to the local area with footpaths and bus routes. It is only a short walk from Bat & Ball railway station.

The site currently benefits from a small open tarmac car park and a larger gated parking area of a gravel hardstanding accessed off Mill Lane. There are also cycle stands adjacent to the pavilion. The proposals will include for the resurfacing and delineation of the existing parking area, to create a more efficient use of space, with a small grasscrete extension adjacent to the existing pavilion and another gated one to the north for temporary additional parking for emergency and club vehicles during home match days, thereby increasing the capacity from 42 to 74 spaces.

Landscaping & Biodiversity

As part of the car park resurfacing, we will also be proposing additional mixed

planting areas and footpaths to provide connections between the car park, play area, pavilion and football pitches. This includes a small tree lined pedestrian route.

These improvements, along with the grass roofs and wall to the clubhouse, will provide additional habitats and increase the overall biodiversity of the site.

Sevenoaks Football Club are committed to engaging with the local community as part of the design and consultation process.

Due to Covid-19, we are unable to have an on-site public exhibition, therefore this will now be held online. We hope you will be able to attend.

Sevenoaks Town FC



History: Sevenoaks Town were originally formed in 1883, one of the founding members of the Kent League.

In April the same year, the club played Royal Arsenal, then the only professional club in the South East of England in front of around 1000 spectators at Knole Paddock.

They combined with St Johns United in 1951, and joined the Western section of the Kent Amateur League.

Division 1 League Cup winners in 1965-66, they were twice winners of the Premier Division in 1968-69 and 1975-76.

They won the Kent County League - three times - 1984-85, 1995-96 and 2002-3. The club were Kent Intermediate Challenge Shield and Inter-Regional Challenge Cup winners twice, and lifted the Sevenoaks Charity Cup on 12 occasions.



Shoot-out anguish as Town bow out of FA Youth Cup

Sevenoaks Town's youngsters slipped out of the FA Youth Cup at the first hurdle beaten 4-2 on penalties at Erith Town on Wednesday night.

They came from behind to lead 2-1 just before the hour, before conceding a second to take the Preliminary Round tie into a shootout decider.

Home keeper Sam Stiles kept out Oaks' first two spot-kicks, the hosts scoring all four to progress to the next round in front of a gate of nearly 280.

Manager Sam Lansdale said: "I am obviously gutted for the boys, and felt they deserved a result.

"I thought they did enough to win and had a lot of possession.

"It was the first time since 2012 that we have taken part, when we got to the first round proper, so this was a short but sweet experience for them in what is a very prestigious competition.

Oaks had to reshuffle after losing injured pair Michael Peate (head) Caleb Edorh (hamstring) in the the first half, then Paul Driver limped off later with an ankle injury.

Joe Chalkar lobbed Erith in front from the edge of the area, before Elliott Duncan's far post header levelled things up for Oaks, heading in Jack Longland's deep cross with almost the last action of the first half.

Will Mullen's impressive 25-yard strike 12 minutes after the restart, turned things around, before Alfie Curnow made it 2-2 from close range.

STFC COVID-19 Policy Statement

The entire team at Sevenoaks Football Club are committed to providing a safe football environment.

COVID-19 RestrictionsIn accordance with the current Government guidelines and The FA guidelines, individuals can play match football and carry out competitive training with additional control measures in place. All of the well-publicised Government social distancing and hygiene requirements must be fully observed in and around the match and training pitches and parking areas at all times.

At the Bourne Stadium, anyone entering will be subject to a machine temperature check with anyone failing this check refused entry on safety grounds. In addition, there will be no access to the changing rooms except where league guidance requires it for matches or for safeguarding purposes. We have provided player/parent guidance and we are constantly receiving updates from The FA and Government which we will ensure to update our control measures when any further changes can be made. The measures that have been put in place are for you, your family and everyone else's safety.

- An individual is required to self-assess before travelling to a match/training and if showing any symptoms of the virus or has been in contact with someone displaying symptoms within the last two weeks, then they should stay at home and call 111. They should remain isolated until it is safe to return.
- We will be complying with additional control measure when carrying out match play and training with social distancing measures before, during breaks and after match play/training. Please respect each other and any decisions that are made on behalf of the club for safety reasons.
- For training, a maximum number of people are allowed into the designated training area within the red zone at any one time in order for social distancing to take place when contact training is not taking place.
 STFC and their coaches will abide by this maximum number as provided by The FA.

- All training activities are undertaken entirely at your own risk and parents/players must sign up to participate in footballing activity along with signing up to The FA's 'Code of Behaviour'.
- All players and attendees to training and matches are required to provide contact information to enable STFC to support the NHS Track and Trace program and all information provided will be covered under the club's Data Protection Policy.
- Players/parents/officials should arrive at the designated match/training time as entrance to the pitch will not be permitted before this time.
- All parents not remaining pitch side will be asked to drop and collect their children at the allotted time from the edge of the pitch or if at the Bourne Stadium from outside the around exit.
- Players should bring to training with them, named hand gel bottle and named water bottle as well as naming any other item they bring such as sun cream, medication, etc, for their own personal use.
- All training equipment will be appropriately sanitised including football equipment such as footballs, cones, goal posts and any other training equipment being used.
- At the Bourne Stadium, all signage for social distancing is installed in the ground to remind everyone of social distancing with volunteers to provide continued guidance.
- At the Bourne Stadium, the entrance and exit touch points, along with other areas at the ground will be sanitised with a cleaning sanitiser which continues to work for up to 30 days after it has been applied.
- Periodic touchpoint testing will take place to measure levels of microbes present on surfaces at the Bourne Stadium to ensure the sanitising program in place is effective. We look forward to welcoming you back to the club.
